


- Start at Georges Close where Whipton Lane meets Vaughan Rd. Enter Hamlin Lane playing field from Georges Close and follow stream to far end
- 21 At Polsloe Bridge station (public toilets) turn right under bridge on Pinhoe Road
- Cross Pinhoe Rd at traffic lights at Beacon Lane junction. Turn left then right along path beside pub
- Footpath crosses straight over Beacon Avenue and under railway
- 24 Straight up St Katherines Rd to cross Calthorpe Rd at central refuge into Mincinglake Valley Park
- Keep to main gravel track to left through Mincinglake Valley Park
- Cross Stoke Hill to bridleway opposite
- Keep to bridleway between houses and stream, turning left uphill after play area, then left at top of hill and left again (to avoid steep muddy bridleway, go left through play area to Stoke Valley Road. Turn right and up to Pennsylvania Rd)
- Emerge at junction of Pennsylvania Rd and Stoke Valley Rd








The EXETER GREEN CIRCLE is a twelve-mile walk that provides a great walking experience within the boundaries of Exeter - from countryside valley parks to the pavements of quiet leafy suburbs.

This part of the Green Circle follows Mincinglake stream between its source in the rolling farmland north of Sylvania Park and on to the former village of Whipton. The walk includes Mincinglake Valley Park, a former landfill site, now an attractive countryside park with butterfly-rich flower meadows. There are superb views down the Exe estuary to the sea from viewpoints near the route in the Valley Park.




