URINATING OR DEFACATING IN ANY STREET OR PUBLIC PLACE

BYELAWS MADE BY THE EXETER CITY COUNCIL IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 235 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1972 FOR THE GOOD RULE AND GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF EXETER AND FOR THE PREVENTION AND SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES:

1. No person shall urinate or defacate in any street or public place.
2. Any person offending against this byelaw shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Level 2 on the Standard Scale.

EXETER CITY COUNCIL

(CONTROL OF DOGS ON ROADS) ORDER 1987

THE EXETER CITY COUNCIL (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), being a District Council for the purposes of the Local Government Act 1972, pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the said Act with the Devon County Council, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under Section 31 of the Road Traffic Act 1972 (which said Act of 1972 is hereinafter referred to as the "Act of 1972"), and of all enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 31(4) of the Act of 1972 and with certain representative organisations in accordance with Regulation 3 of the Control of Dogs on Roads Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations, 1962, hereby make the following Order:-

PART I - GENERAL

1. This Order shall come into operation on the First day of January 1988 and may be cited as "The Exeter City Council (Control of Dogs on Roads) Order 1987".
2.
 - (1) "designated road" has the meaning assigned to it by Article 3 of this Order
 - (2) The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1972 or by or under any other enactment.
 - (3) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

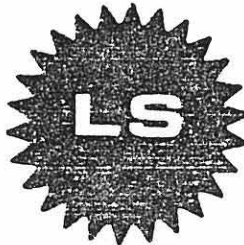
PART II - DESIGNATED ROADS

3. The Council hereby specify as a designated road each and every length of road (which term shall include pavements or footways but exclude public footpaths and bridleways) in the City of Exeter.

PART III - CONTROL OF DOGS

4. Save as provided in Article 5 of this Order, no person shall cause or permit a dog to be on a designated road without the dog being held on a lead.
5.
 - (i) Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply to dogs which are the property of a police authority and which are at the material time being used for police purposes.
 - (ii) Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply to dogs proved to be kept for driving or tending sheep or cattle in the course of a trade or business.
 - (iii) Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply to dogs which are proved to have been at the material time in use under proper control for sporting purposes.

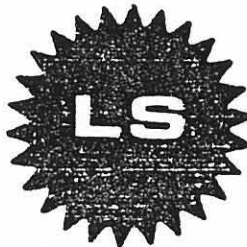
