

Exeter's Underground Passages were built in the 14th & 15th centuries to bring a supply of fresh drinking water into the city. Before taking a guided tour underground, visitors pass through an exciting interpretation centre packed full of interactive displays, including a talking figure of a medieval man, a high-speed video fly-through the Passages, a full size model of a section of the Passages and artefacts from the Princesshay archaeological dig. A visit to Exeter's Underground Passages includes a 10 minute film presentation, a 25 minute tour underground and an opportunity to explore the exhibition.



Visitor Information

- First tour generally starts half an hour after opening and at regular intervals throughout the day.
- Please arrive at least 10 minutes before your tour is due to start.
- Under 5s are not permitted on tours of Exeter's Underground Passages, but free access to the exhibition is permitted with an accompanying adult.
- Wheelchair and pushchair access is restricted to the exhibition only.
- Visitors should be aware that the Passages are constricted and low in places and are not suitable for those who suffer from claustrophobia.
- Sensible footwear is recommended.
- We are unable to take tours containing only one person.
- During school holidays and at weekends we are very busy, it is advisable to book in advance to avoid disappointment.
- Gifts and souvenirs are available.
